Background information

Raystede Centre for Animal Welfare, established in 1972, is a charity that aims to give animals a better life through rehoming, rehabilitation and sanctuary, and give people the support and knowledge they need to treat animals with care and respect. We care for more than 400 animals every day, including cats, horses, dogs, rabbits, hens and exotic birds. We help most of the animals find new homes but also provide life-long sanctuary for those animals that cannot be rehomed. Our beautiful 43 acre site is open for visitors to get a unique glimpse into a working animal welfare centre.

Animals are at the heart of everything we do but we could not care for them without our expert and dedicated team of staff and volunteers. Surrounded by animals, lakes, trees and fields with a café, shops, parking and many other benefits, Raystede is an uplifting and rewarding place to work.

The Estates team is part of the Finance and Resources department and ensure that all buildings and grounds are maintained to a high standard and support teams with improvement projects and essential repairs.

Main Purpose of the role:

- Ensure all buildings and grounds are maintained to a high standard
- Carry out project work, repairs & construction, and general maintenance.
- Work with contractors on projects

Key Tasks

- Move materials to worksite and ensure all tools, machinery and other equipment is safely set up
- Using correct equipment and machinery maintain paths, including loose stone, gravel, block paving and tarmac and assist with re-stoning, patching, edging etc
- Use correct tools, machinery, and equipment to erect fences including, close board, stock, willow and hazel, split rail, chain link and picket etc
- Use correct tools, machinery, and equipment to construct and deconstruct buildings
- Use correct tools, machinery, and equipment to construct and deconstruct walls and stonework
- Operate equipment like drills, hammers, shovels, and other heavy machinery
- Operate workshop tools such as electric planers, bench grinders, drills, grinder wheels, benchtop bandsaws
- Operate heavy machinery such as digger, dumper trucks and forklifts as licenced to do so

- Climb to heights and conduct work as instructed including roof, gutter and window repairs and projects as required
- Lift and carry materials and equipment as needed including to load and unload materials from trucks and vehicles and move materials about in work areas
- Use chemicals and hazardous substances as instructed
- Perform routine facility inspections including path inspections, fire call points and lighting, building inspections
- To use and be responsible for personal use of Raystede equipment and machinery before, during and after each use to include cleaning and basic safety checks of equipment and machinery
- Operate manual material handling equipment such as wheelbarrows, trolleys and carts safely
- Dig trenches for cabling and pipe work
- Carry out snow clearance and gritting in the winter months when required
- Lay foundations for animal buildings and outbuildings
- Carry out proactive and reactive building repairs and maintenance across a wide range of building types, including animal housing, office buildings, commercial and farm buildings.
- Respond to ad-hoc maintenance needs as required including in support of animal care
- Prioritising and reprioritising tasks and a changing workload as necessary
- Use technical experience to identify and resolve problems
- From time to time be expected to be part of special projects as are reasonably required
- Supervise contractors onsite where instructed
- Flexibility to travel to our charity shops for maintenance tasks or contractor supervision
