#### **Background Information:**

Raystede Centre for Animal Welfare, established in 1952, is a charity that aims to give animals a better life through rehoming, rehabilitation and sanctuary, and give people the support and knowledge they need to treat animals with care and respect. We care for more than 400 animals every day, including cats, horses, dogs, rabbits, hens and exotic birds. We help most of the animals find new homes but also provide life-long sanctuary for those animals that cannot be rehomed. Our beautiful 43 acre site is open for visitors to get a unique glimpse into a working animal welfare centre. Animals are at the heart of everything we do but we could not care for them without our expert and dedicated team of staff and volunteers. Surrounded by animals, lakes, trees and fields with a café, shops, parking and many other benefits, Raystede is an uplifting and rewarding place to work.

The PA to the CEO plays a key coordinating role in the running of Raystede.

#### Main Purpose of the role:

Working with the Chief Executive, Board of Trustees and with the Senior Management Team, provide confidential, professional, comprehensive and efficient senior secretarial, project, governance and administrative support.

## **Key responsibilities:**

## Personal Assistant support to CEO and SMT

- Provide comprehensive senior secretarial support to the CEO, including diary management, managing communications, editing and preparing documents and reports, meeting and greeting contacts, organising lunches, organising travel and accommodation.
- Provide project and communications support as delegated, including carrying out background research and presenting findings, editing and producing documents, briefing papers, reports, newsletter and presentations.
- Managing relationships, including as a first point of contact to the CEO's office: dealing with correspondence
  and phone calls. Liaising on behalf of the CEO with internal and external contacts, staff, volunteers, donors
  and visitors as necessary.
- Provide senior secretarial and administrative support for the Senior Management Team as a group or individually where necessary. This includes preparing the Duty Manager 7 day rota.
- Responsible for the running of the CEO office, post, ordering stationery.
- Provide a range of logistical and administration support on behalf of CEO's office, including organising internal and external events, and arranging courses and conferences within the UK and overseas.
- Devising/maintaining office systems, including data management and filing.

Reminding the CEO and SMT of important tasks and deadlines.

### **Governance support**

- Provide senior secretarial, coordination and administrative support for the Chair and Trustees.
- Manage annual calendar for Board and Sub-committee meetings, ensuring timing fits with business, financial and governance cycles.
- Collate reports/information for Board packs.
- Provide governance support to senior meetings, including Board, sub-committees, senior management team, and other ad hoc meetings as required. This includes drafting agendas, collating papers in advance, coordinating meetings (virtual and/or physical), taking minutes covering complex and sensitive items, and follow up on agreed actions.
- Minute-taking at Board meetings and other senior level meetings.

### **Key working relationships:**

Internal – Trustees, SMT, all staff and volunteers.

External – donors, supporters, visitors, general public.

## Scope & limits of authority

**Decision making** – correspondence, phone calls, diary management, office systems, presentation of documentation, timing and manner of progress-chasing items in support of CEO or governance levels.

**Financial resources** – coordinating stationery ordering for the organisation. Managing catering and venue hire for certain events.

#### **Material resources:**

Information and communication resources – responsible for handling highly confidential matters. Liaison with a very wide range of people involved in the management of Raystede (Trustees, SMT, CEO) including preparing accurate minutes of meetings (6 Board meetings 4 Finance Committees, AGM etc). Maintaining key documents such as the Governance Framework or the Business Continuity Plan. Talking to a wide range of influential people and organisations on behalf of the CEO including major donors and honorary officials. Creating the quarterly staff newsletter and organising Staff Forums.

**People management** – liaising with a very wide range of staff and volunteers and representing the CEO's office in the best possible way. Persuading people to meet deadlines!
