Background information

Raystede Centre for Animal Welfare, established in 1952, is a charity that aims to give animals a better life through rehoming, rehabilitation and sanctuary, and give people the support and knowledge they need to treat animals with care and respect. We care for more than 400 animals every day, including cats, horses, dogs, rabbits, hens and exotic birds. We help most of the animals find new homes but also provide life-long sanctuary for those animals that cannot be rehomed. Our beautiful 43 acre site is open for visitors to get a unique glimpse into a working animal welfare centre.

Animals are at the heart of everything we do but we could not care for them without our expert and dedicated team of staff and volunteers. Surrounded by animals, lakes, trees and fields with a café, shops, parking and many other benefits, Raystede is an uplifting and rewarding place to work.

The Prevention and Education team is led by the Head of Prevention and Education and consists of a team of community, on-site and digital-focused education officers. The team is responsible for delivering a varied programme of educational activities, both interpersonally through events and community work, to a range of audiences and through content creation such as signage, information leaflets and online resources. The department is directed by the Prevention and Education strategic goals of promoting good welfare and preventing poor welfare for animals.

Main Purpose of the role:

To apply various research methods to research animal welfare issues and ensure the
organisation and public audiences are informed. The research will be used by the job holder
and others in the organisation to promote good welfare for animals and inform new project
directions.

Key Tasks

- Conducting literature reviews when directed
- Assisting with the drafting of project proposals by undertaking and presenting research and/or insights projects as directed
- Setting up and undertaking qualitative research such as interviews, online or by phone
- Carrying out mystery shopper tasks by phone or in person, particularly within the 'pet business' sector i.e. vets and pet shops to help inform research conclusions.

- Presenting research and insights findings in written reports and via online or in-person presentations.
- Undertaking quantitative research through the collection and analysis of data via our monitoring and evaluation systems.
- Supporting in day-to-day education program activity such as attending meetings
- Attending conferences and online meetings on behalf of Raystede and reporting back on insights gained.
- Working closely with the Marketing Team to:
 - Create final-proof copy and imagery for content such as articles, blogs, leaflets, posters, social media posts, signs and web pages to support Prevention and Education goals.
 - Plan internal communications to ensure staff and volunteers are able to keep up to date on Raystede animal-related situations
 - Assist with increasing engagement across all social media platforms, including the sourcing of related articles and news stories, to share across relevant channels.
 - Editing tour or talk scripts to ensure they are up to date and factually correct. In some cases communicating with external representatives to ensure the accuracy of external messaging.
- Sharing key research reports such as the PSDA PAW report and other animal welfare charity annual publications and presenting key relevant findings to all staff.
- Researching and presenting evidence to support campaigns, projects, and strategic directions
- Working independently to create briefs and working with others to carry out research projects and inform the organisation on key issues
- Identifying areas of need for research or insights and taking self-motivated approach to providing the organisation with what it needs.
- Liaison with and management of relationships with suppliers and volunteers
- Contributing to the strategic direction of the Charity by supporting and scoping new activities as directed by the Prevention and Education strategy and the overall organisational strategy
